The OBHS Archives was founded to preserve the history of Ocean Beach and the peninsula. The Archives Room is housed in space rented from the PLUM Church in O.B., where the OBHS programs are held.

The collection includes: Photos, maps, books, papers, newspapers, letters & artifacts. Also, an extensive biography index and San Diego City Directories from 1926 to 1984 which list people, their spouses & occupations. Residents are also listed by street address. Dedicated volunteers assist with the processing.

DONATIONS TO THE ARCHIVES ARE WELCOME.

Many people believe that their lives are of no interest to others, but they are!

Unfortunately, photographs, house plans, business & organization records, and family papers end up in the trash after a death in the family... photographs depicting people, their activities & customs, homes & buildings, and dress. Some O.B. buildings vanish or functions change almost overnight and new ones appear. The cliffs erode and scenery changes. The OBHS Archives provide an invaluable window into O.B.'s past.

When donating photographs to the Archives, please remember to date, identify the people and places in them. Reluctant to give up your photos or papers? The Archive's staff would be happy to copy and safely return items to you with your permission to use the materials.

Charles Curtis & Bob Wright

Charles Curtis and Bob Wright had much in common. They are exemplarily examples of men from "the greatest generation". Both men had science backgrounds. They had extraordinary organizational skills, sharp minds and loved working with their hands. They especially loved wood and metal working; and had the skills to build and create what many only dream about. They donated time and help to the Ocean Beach Historical Society.

CHARLES D. CURTIS, 92,
PASSED AWAY OCTOBER 28, 2014

Born in Connecticut, Charles (Chuck) moved to Point Loma at age 4 to attend Madame Tingley's Theosophical School on the site of the current Point Loma Nazarene College. After his service in WWII Chuck married Margaret Robinson the daughter of Alfred D. Robinson who created the P.L. Rosecroft Gardens and was the famous Balboa Park horticulturist. Chuck built their first home in Point Loma. He worked for the Naval Undersea Research and Development Lab on Point Loma as a Physical Science Technician. In 1970 the Curtis family moved to Ramona. Chuck worked his 20 acres, "Pains 'n Acres", for 45 years. He planted many pine trees, including Torrey Pines started by seeds from Madame Tingley's original pines. Chuck knew the names of every flower, bush and tree, and was an extensive explorer of San Diego County's back country.

He was predeceased by his beloved Margaret Robinson Curtis. He is survived by his 5 children, 3 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren.



ROBERT G. WRIGHT, AGE 86,
PASSED AWAY DECEMBER 26, 2014

Bob Wright came to San Diego at the age of 13 in 1941. Following his service in the U.S. Army, he worked for General Dynamics for 40 year. He was immensely interested in San Diego history. Bob was a long-time volunteer with the Maritime Museum of San Diego, especially working on the restoration of the historic sailing ship Star of India. For several years Bob lived aboard the Star of India as a caretaker. From 1967 to 2013 Bob did hundreds of oral history interviews.

More recently, he volunteered with the Air and Space Museum, working to restore historic aircraft, at the museum's Gillespie Field site in El Cajon. Bob was an active member of the Congress of History of San Diego and Imperial Counties since 1999. Bob received an 2009 Award of Appreciation from the Congress of History at their annual conference, for his volunteering, doing oral interviews on his own, and assisting so many local-history groups. He is survived by his wife, Joyce Wright, of San Diego, and her adult children.
